September 2023 ALDERLEY EDGE CP SCHOOL

This survey was taken at the end of the 2022/2023 academic year to review the school year.
The purpose of the survey was to gain views on various aspects of school life from across the whole community. Parents were asked to complete one survey for each of their children in school.
The questions chose mirror those used in the parent questionnaire used by OFSTED.
48 parents out of 196 children responded (24% response rate)
All responses were anonymous
In many areas of the responses, such as quality of teaching and behaviour parents now strongly agree rather than agree and we see this as a positive improvement. Children are happy and feel safe with the vast majority of parents strongly agreeing to this statement
Children are well taught by caring staff
Parents comment that AECPS is: A friendly and welcoming school An inclusive school
 Children know what to do if they have a problem The children are well taught and make good progress
 The vast majority of parents would recommend our school
