Focus of Meeting – What a School Council Does and Behaviour in School

1) The role of the school council

- a. A school council is a formal group of pupils who act as representatives of their classmates in discussing school issues with Mrs Walsh. It's a brilliant way of representing and contributing to Pupil Voice in your school. Children are elected to represent the views of all pupils and also to improve their school.
- b. The School Councillors lead a meeting with their own classes and teacher and then reports back to Mrs Walsh.
- c. A school council usually meets with Mrs Walsh to discuss and sort out problems. These could include school lunches, behaviour or ideas for fundraising events.
- d. Members of the school council are responsible for carrying out the ideas that have been agreed upon at the council meeting.

- Each class to decide on their 'Making a Difference' idea for this academic year

2) Behaviour in School

What is behaviour like in your lessons?

- Mostly good 1 or 2 children should out when they are not supposed to
- Usually calm until someone starts talking
- Most people are sensible and do what they are told most of the time, when they are told to stop they do
- We feel confident to tell a teacher and they stop any silly behaviour
- When people laugh it can make others laugh too
