Context:	This survey was taken at the start of the 20/21 academic year to review the previous school year.
	2019-2020 was an unprecedented school year with school closures due to COVID-19 and it is inevitable that this will have impacted the results of the survey in these exceptional times
	Purpose of the survey was to gain views on various aspects of school life from across the whole community. Parents were asked to complete one survey for each of their children in school.
	47 out of 200 children responded (23% response rate)
