Context:	First AECPS survey focused purely on the transition between preschool and reception
	Survey was taken in Autumn 2, just prior to the 1 st parent/teacher meeting
	Purpose of the survey was to gain views on how children transitioned into reception from pre-school setting and consider ways that this important time could be improved to maximise the experience for the children
	13 out of 30 children responded (43% response rate) / 1 response is equivalent to 7.6% of those who contributed
	All responses were anonymous
Areas of Strength:	100% indicated that children had made a good start at AECPS with 75% of these agreeing strongly
	100% indicated that parents would recommend AECPS to friends with 92% of these agreeing strongly
	100% agreed or better that their child felt safe and supported
	100% agreed or better that they felt comfortable approaching the school with questions or problems
Areas of	Continue to review the length of the staggered start and is value balancing this against childcare challenges for parents.
Consideration for the Senior Leadership Team:	Ensuring that Evidence Me is being used effectively for parents.

The short days were very difficult for me to manage as I work full time and my husband cannot take time off during term time. My child did not understand why she had to leave early. Personally think one half day week is fine, know this has been said before - I don't feel there's a need for two weeks of staggered starts and this change would help parents out more re childcare For my child 1 week of staggered starts would have been sufficient. Two seems excessive, especially as there were no parent meetings to learn about the children from parents as in previous years I personally feel that it should only be one week. But I do understand why you do it this way and that it might be too much for some Children.
