## 2021 / 2022 END OF YEAR PARENT SURVEY REPORT

Context:	This survey was taken at the end of the 2021/2022 academic year to review the school year.
	2021 - 2022 was the first full year after the pandemic and the staff worked hard to reinstate all the curriculum and enrichment opportunities over the year. Children were able to resume school visits, residentials, school productions, sport week and many more cultural, sporting, musical and learning activities.
	The purpose of the survey was to gain views on various aspects of school life from across the whole community. Parents were asked to complete one survey for each of their children in school.
	The questions chose mirror those used in the parent questionnaire used by OFSTED.
	35 parents out of 153 families responded (23% response rate)
